This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

My Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

After having reminded the rich man to sell everything and give to the poor to enjoy eternal life in the last weekend's Gospel, it is very clear from the Gospel of today that the disciples are not getting any better despite witnessing Jesus' ministry and listening to His preaching and teaching about the eternal life or the Kingdom of God. There is absolutely nothing wrong in getting a promotion in our workplace if it is based on the quality and the qualification of the person, but is it justifiable to get a promotion through the influence of someone or flattering the boss? In today's Gospel we see, James and John, the two disciples of Jesus, are seeking a promotion; they ask, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." The only quality and the qualification James and John can claim at this point is that they are His cousins.

Today, as we reflect about the core mission of the Church and the primary responsibility of a true Christian, let us not forget the truth that, "God does not call the qualified, but rather God qualifies the called." This is the same message St. Theresa of Calcutta also says, "We are not called to be successful, but to be faithful." Remember the words of Jesus when Mary His mother came to see Him! Jesus asks, "Who is my mother, and who are my bothers?" Pointing to His disciples, He said, "Here are My mother and My brothers. For whoever does the will of My Father in heaven is My brother and sister and mother." Yes, it is the spiritual relationship that matters to Jesus, not the blood relationship.

As Christians we all need a promotion, a promotion from a fan follower of Jesus who seeks blessings from Him to a true disciple of Jesus who understands, accepts and lives Gods' will daily. We all need a promotion from the kingdom of this world to the kingdom of God. To become eligible for a promotion, we need to embrace the passion and death of Jesus in our lives by living for the glory of God through our thoughts, words and actions. This is what Jesus asks His disciples and us through today's Gospel: "Can you drink the cup that I drink, be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" Through this statement, Jesus opens our eyes to the realities ahead of us. By asking this Jesus reminds us of the challenges ahead of us. This the same St. John the Baptist reminds us; "He must increase, and I must increase." Yes, to be a missionary is to be at the service of everyone with a sacrificial love for the salvation of everyone. So, Jesus reminds us, "whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all." So, through service and sacrifice, we shall attain our own salvation. By liberating others, we shall liberate ourselves. By giving peace to others, we shall find our own peace, and by identifying with others, Christ identifies with us.

Dear friends, Jesus does not care about our past, if we are ready to live our present meaningfully, by following His will. So, reflecting the words of St. Mother Theresa "our call is not to be successful, but to be faithful," let us focus our attention to be faithful to our God and to His will so that we will be promoted to the Kingdom of God from this kingdom of world. God Bless.
