Dear Friends in Jesus Christ.

Being the disciple of Jesus, to evangelize the world in the spirit of the Lord, the best weapon Jesus invites us to use against all kind of evil in today's world is called humility: "Learn from me. for I am meek and humble of heart." All the readings of today remind us about the importance of humility in our lives. The first reading says, "Behave humbly and you will find favor with the Lord." St. James declares that God loves the humble but detests the proud (Jas.4:6). The second says that our destination is Mount Zion, the heavenly Jerusalem, and the city of the living God. In this city, only the humble, like that of Angels and Saints, can dwell and the proud cannot because a proud heart cannot worship the Lord.

When we come to the Gospel reading, Jesus uses the imagery of a marriage to teach us about humility. Jesus savs: "... Evervone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted." Jesus teaches the importance of humility and simplicity in our Christian journey. In this regard, we have a lot to learn from the Blessed Virgin Mary who humbled herself. Her humility was so remarkable that God exalted her to be the mother of His Son.

In today's world, many people consider humility as weakness, but for God humility is greatness. So, as Christians, the question to reflect on is, is our life directed towards achieving greatness in this world or before God? There is nothing to lose by being humble. The book of Proverbs tells us, "Humility and the fear of the Lord bring wealth, honor, and life." (Prov. 22: 4). On the contrary, pride results in defeat and shame. The CCC teaches us that, "Humility is the foundation of a sincere prayer." (2559). So, only a humble heart can come to God in prayer. Matthew 15:8 says, "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." Do we have the virtue of humility in our prayer?

Humility is a garment we all need to wear if we desire to make changes in this world or in the lives of other people. It would not only gain favors from God, but it will also open a lot of doors for us. At his first appearance as the Roman Pontiff, Pope Francis

bowed his head and asked the world to pray for him. This act of humility was productive as it touched and changed the lives of many. During a presentation at a certain University a student was holding his paper at his left hand while making his presentation. Seeing him, the professor scolded him harshly and asked him to hold the paper at his right and sit down. The young man raised his right arm for everyone to see that half of it was cut off. The professor seeing this came to the student knelt down before him and begged to be forgiven because he did not know about his disability. This act of the professor touched and changed the life of not only the student but many other students.

Dear friends, God is not interested in what we are; but who we are, as that is where humility can be found. So let us humbly implore the Lord: "O Jesus! Meek and humble of heart, make my heart like yours." God Bless.
