A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

On the day of the Ascension of the Lord, Jesus reminded His disciples and all of us about the purpose of our Christian vocation by commanding us to; "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature," by assuring His continued support and presence with us through the power and the strength of the Holy Spirt. This past Sunday, when we celebrated the Pentecost Jesus fulfilled His promise by sending the Holy Spirit to His disciples and all of us. Today, we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. From the Gospel reading we come to know that, though the disciples were given the power of the Holy Spirit, still they were not prepared to place their complete trust in the Lord, "When they all saw Him, they worshiped, but they doubted." However, Jesus did not lose His heart or get upset with them, but continued to encourage and remind them by saying, "All power in heaven and earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Jesus not only encouraged and reminded them again about their responsibility, but also assured His continued support by saying, "I am with you always, until the end of the age." Dear friends, if we seriously reflect about the Gospel reading, we will realize that our life is not different than the disciples. For sure, just as Jesus is patient with His disciples, He is patient with all of us too, and so we are here today.

Today, we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. A beautiful subject to talk a lot about, but unfortunately, I cannot, nor anyone, because it is a mystery. Yes, the Holy Trinity is a mystery to be loved, not a problem to be solved. A problem can be solved, explained and one's involvement is not at all necessary. Whereas in the case of a mystery, it cannot be solved, and one cannot be away from it, but must fully involve in it, only then he or she can have the experience of it. At the same time the experience can be different from person to person. Yes, it is a mystery too big for our minds to understand, but we can grasp bits and pieces of it. So, a definition cannot be made on the Holy Trinity.

On this feast of the Holy Trinity, the Church reminds us that the three divine persons are not divided in their actions of grace; instead, they work and walk together. They have the same mission, which is the salvation of the world. The Father sent the Son to redeem the world. And the Father and the Son sent us the Holy Spirit as our helper in our mission in this world. None of them have absolute dominance over a particular period. This is because, despite being three distinct persons, they have one essence. They are eternally one and united.

In the first reading, Moses reminds the people that they belong to God. What God did for them by leading them out of the slavery of Egypt with many miracles, God did not do for any other people. So, Moses asks them to always remember that the Lord is God and to keep his commandments. In the second reading, without offering any systematic teaching on the Holy Trinity, Paul presents the three divine persons in their concrete forms and actions: "Led by the Spirit, we are sons of God...And we are heirs with Christ." It is the same Spirit that proceeds from both the Father and the Son that helps us to call God Abba Father.

In today's Gospel, Christ himself revealed the mystery of the three divine persons to us. He revealed this with a mandate: "Go and make disciples of all nations." baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit." This is the Trinitarian formula. So, any sincere prayer offered in the name of the Holy Trinity bears a mark of excellence. Yes, we are all baptized in the name of our Trinitarian God and offered everything that they have in their possession, Wisdom of the Father, Love of the Son, and the strength of the Holy Spirit. However, these gifts of wisdom, love and strength should be obtained by each of us by observing all that Jesus has commanded. So, as we continue to celebrate this Holy Mass, let us continue to make every effort to work with the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit to create a better world here. God Bless.
