Dear Loving Friends in Jesus Christ,

After inviting us to administer our prophetic role as a true Christian to build the Kingdom of God and reminding us about the challenges attached to this great mission in the last weekend's readings, today we see Jesus is sending His disciples for a mission trip with many conditions. By placing conditions for their mission trip, Jesus is not aiming to make their mission trip more difficult, rather to be more effective and productive. So, to say, building of the Kingdom of God is not built with material things of this world but rather with the spiritual things of His world with Faith, Hope and Love. To obtain these spiritual things Jesus says, "Learn from me, for I am meek and humble in heart." (Mt.11:29)

Every life we choose in our lives comes with certain conditions to be followed. Through the Gospel of today Jesus is presenting us a missionary package. Church by its very nature is a missionary and every Christian is called to be a missionary. So, without exception all of us are expected to accept this package of Jesus besides our vocation in life, if we are serious about the Kingdom of God.

When we plan for a trip, usually we make so many preparations. Today, when the disciples of Jesus are called to make a missionary trip, Jesus messes up all their normal understanding of a trip. Please keep in mind that the disciples are not invited for a normal pleasure trip, but a missionary trip. Jesus instructs His disciples, "Do not take bread, no bag, no money in their purse, but they are allowed to have a walking stick and pair of sandals, but no extra pair of dress." Now, in the place of the disciples, we are given instructions like this for our trip, what would be our reaction? I am sure, we will find many excuses to skip this missionary journey such as; I am not worthy enough, I am not feeling well today, I have another appointment, I have already planned my vacation etc., Please remember the words of St. Paul in the second reading of last Sunday, "do not focus on our weakness and our unworthiness, but rather focus on the grace of God because it is by the grace of God, I am what I am." Dear friends, every excuse we make in our spiritual journey for not finding time for God is the same as telling Jesus that, No, no I do not want to place my life into your hands or tune my life according to your will. Thus, we make the proclamation that, even without God we can live in this world. Thus, we all behave the like the people of Jesus's hometown who rejected Him.

The instructions of Jesus to His disciples are like cutting the wings of a bird and forcing the bird to fly away far. Be sure that Jesus never said anything lightly or to fool anybody, but whenever He says something, He really means it. Today, Jesus is telling

His disciples and each of us to make a journey not to places like Owensboro or Chicago or New York, but here itself. Jesus is asking us to make a journey from oneself to Himself, ready to take up a transformation in our lives, from present life to the life of Jesus. So, it is not a journey to, but it is a journey into. The journey into is a challenge to find the core of one's own self-I am a Child of God. So, Jesus is giving us the message that, to be a Christian means to be Christ like. Thus, Jesus reminds us that holding on to material things will not guarantee a safe journey to Christ. Yes, Jesus wants all of us back to Him in a perfect and complete manner, so He wants us to put our whole faith in Him and in Him alone. Yes, Jesus declared, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind and love your neighbor as yourself.'..." This is the will of God for us and His mission in this world.
