Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Since the last couple of weeks, Jesus had been trying to get our attention to understand the mystery of the Holy Eucharist. Referring to the Old Testament, manna given to the people of Isarael in the wilderness, Jesus said, "Your ancestors ate manna in the wilderness and still they died. I am the bread of life that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die." In last weekend's Gospel we had seen that hearing this comment of Jesus, the Jews began to murmur among themselves, and by seeing their lack of faith in Him, Jesus told them very clearly that, "They shall all be taught by God."

In today's Gospel we see that the murmuring among the Jews have turned out to be a big guarrel among themselves. The reason is simple. They were full of pride and lacked true wisdom. They could not understand what Jesus meant. They refused to be humbled, to become wise in the ways of God. Our first reading of today reminds us that, God himself is the Wisdom, and invites us to His banquet. However, only the humble can appreciate and take advantage of this invitation. Those who lack the wisdom of God, who live according to the standard of this world cannot understand this mystery. The Eucharist is a special banquet where Christ is both the giver and the gift. Also, He is both the priest and the sacrificial lamb. At times, some of us act like the Jewish people of Jesus' time forgetting the truth that we can understand this great mystery of faith only through the wisdom of God. So, like the Jews, some of us still wonder: "How could He give us His body and blood to eat and drink?" Is Christ really present in the Eucharist?

So, understanding the thought process of many people, in the second reading we see that St. Paul is giving us a strong warning; "Be careful about the life that you live, be intelligent and do not act like senseless people...don't be thoughtless people, but recognize the will of the Lord in your lives...So that always and everywhere you may give thanks to God..." Yes, only intelligent and thoughtful people see and encounter Christ in the Holy Eucharist. They respond to God's invitation to have life and real wisdom. They know that it is the will of God that we should have life in its fullness. They know that this fullness of life is in Christ, will be possible only through the living bread of life, the Eucharist. Some of us might have "seemingly good reasons" for not responding positively to the Eucharistic banquet. However, the truth is that no reason is good enough for not responding to God's invitation to share from His banquet and true wisdom. No reason is good enough not to accept the life that Jesus freely offers us through the Eucharist. So, let us humble ourselves and heed this very important

call from God. All we need to do is to work on those obstacles that prevent us from receiving the body and blood of Christ with holiness. If we still doubt, ask God to illuminate our mind so that we will doubt no more. If we have sinned, seek counsel and reconciliation with Christ through the Sacrament of Penance.

Once, Francis Assisi and his friend Leo were going for an evening walk. As they were walking, they found a leaper lying on the roadside in bad shape. They carried the leaper to their house and gave him a bath. As they were giving the bath the leaper whenever the hands of Assisi touched the hands of Leo, he felt something different. After giving the bath to the leaper, Francis applied ointment on the leaper and was about to leave the room, the leaper caught the hands of Francis and kissed them and said, "I smell Christ in You." With tears Francis came out of the room. Dear friends, this the real Eucharistic experience we are all called to experience and share with our dear and near ones and everyone in the world. Once again today, the psalmist reminds us: "Taste and see that the Lord is good!"
