Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.



Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

Jesus says, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have not come to abolish them, but to fulfill them." (Matt. 15:7) Many places in the Gospels we can see that Jesus is modifying the Old Testament law into New Testament law of love. In the Old Testament, people's religious lives were purely guided and controlled by Mosaic law, where love of God and neighbor were not relevant. If you remember the Gospel of last weekend, we saw that, the women were not given permission to initiate divorce for any reason, but Jesus opposes any kind of divorce and says that divorce is not the plan of God from the beginning of creation. In the Old Testament, people thought that doing some religious practices and following the Mosaic law will help them to attain eternal life, but Jesus says that to attain eternal life, love of God and love of neighbor should complement in one's life.

The tragedy of today's world is that there are many people with lots of knowledge, but they do not know how to use them in a proper way, because they lack the wisdom of God. For sure, knowledge is a power, but wisdom is powerful.

Our first reading says, Wisdom is the most precious of all pearls. She is God himself. All good things come from and must return to Him. Nothing can be compared with Her. Nothing has value without Her. Whoever possesses her has everything. So, St. Augustine reminds us that: Our heart must not rest until it is united with this precious Wisdom. The second reading, describes the Word of God as: "a double-edged sword that cuts across the bones." It simply reminds us that the word of God is the ultimate and irresistible power through which God reaches and enriches us. The Word of God transforms every heart that humbly receives it. The wisdom of God is incarnated through the Word of God to us.

In today's Gospel, a rich young man encounters Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God, and Jesus reminds him of the commandments that deal with our relationships with other people, challenging him to sell what he has and to give the money to the poor. It highlights the fact that, a truly rich person is one who possesses true Wisdom and not just material wealth alone. It also, reminds us of how material wealth could be a grave obstacle to obtaining true Wisdom. The rich man in today's Gospel came to justify himself and testified his religious piety and believed that he had done all things well. Indeed, Jesus appreciated his effort. However, Christ knew that something was really lacking in him. Christ found in him only one problem, attachment to his wealth. Thus, Jesus' challenge exposed two missing pieces

in the rich young man's life: a sense of compassion for the poor and a willingness to share his blessings with the needy. The Gospel says that the man went away sad because he had so much wealth. He did all things well but lacked the wisdom to understand that the key to eternal life was detachment from this world. Jesus also challenges the disciple and the Jewish belief that material wealth and prosperity are signs of God's blessings, while poverty and difficulties are the signs of His displeasure. So, Jesus says, "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."

There are important lessons to learn from today's readings. First, we might have a weak spot unknown to us. Only the wisdom of God can help us illuminate this. Second, at times, it seems to us that we have done "all things well." Unfortunately, pride and love of this world makes it difficult for us to see the true reality of our lives. Third, we must not allow material wealth or anything of this world to become an obstacle between us and eternal life. Today, Jesus very clearly teaches us that attachment to wealth is the easiest way to forsake God. It makes our spiritual journey very heavy, difficult, and almost impossible. Finally, we may have so many things in our lives, but if we lack the wisdom of God, our life is in danger. So, with the psalmist, let us humbly say to God, the true wisdom: "Fill us with your love, that we may rejoice." God Bless.
