

We the people of the Catholic churches of McLean County come together as a loving parish family-reaching out as one, with open hearts, minds and souls to share our love for God and our neighbor centered around the Holy Eucharist.



Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

The only medium through which we can approach, experience and understand God and His will is through our true faith in God. Without faith, however we try to approach, experience and understand God and His will end up in a disappointing situation. This is the reason, in last weekend's Gospel we had seen that Jesus turned towards the people and told them by understanding their wrong intention to follow Him, "Amen, amen I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." After pointing a finger towards people's wrong intention, Jesus also reminded them to have a good intention and right faith in Him by saying, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." By this invitation, Jesus continues to get us closer to Himself to save, feed and strengthen us on our journey towards the Kingdom of God. Today, the bread of life is the Holy Eucharist. Thus, today's readings give us another opportunity to reflect on the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the mystery of our faith, and the life of the world.

In last Weekend's Gospel, manna is the bread that God gave to the people of Israel in the desert, as they were travelling to the promised land. At that time, Jesus told the people that God is giving them something superior to manna here, that the true bread from heaven that gives life to the world. Thus, Jesus identifies Himself as the superior bread that gives eternal life and asking people to believe that. But people are not ready to believe what Jesus said and began to question Him, and so Jesus says, "they shall be taught by God." God gave Manna from heaven to the people of Israel, to satisfy their physical need of hunger. But when Jesus says that, "I am the bread that came down from heaven, to give eternal life", this bread satisfies all their needs. Yes, Jesus wants to satisfy all our needs, not just some of our needs; so, He is asking us to believe that, "He is the bread that came down from heaven" - the Eucharist. Only if we can have a strong faith in the Holy Eucharist, we can lead a true Christian life and a satisfied life.

There is no doubt, one must have true faith to understand today's Gospel, because Jesus is talking to us about a great mystery we celebrate now, the Eucharist. A mystery cannot be understood by our knowledge, but only through the wisdom of God, which is attained through our faith in Jesus. To nourish our faith in Jesus we need to understand that Church is the school, Faith is the subject and God is the teacher. Unless and until we come to the school, how can the teacher-God teach us the subject of Faith? Because Jesus says, "they shall be taught by *God.*" Now, the question to be answered by each of us is, am I willing to be taught by God. If we are willing to be taught by God, the mysteries of faith, it is important that we go to Him through our prayers, word of God, sacraments etc.

Jesus, the loving savior does not want anyone of us to be left out or wandering in this world without any proper guidance; so, Jesus reminds us again, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven: whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." As we live in this world, all our hard work is toward earning the bread to maintain a healthy body to live in this world. But the body is only a part of our human life, which is limited to this world only. A healthy body does not create a healthy world. But Jesus promises a healthy world, through the integral health of a person provided we eat the bread that came from Heaven-Jesus Himself-the Eucharist, with true faith. At this point, let us reflect about the question Jesus is asking- "For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?" (Mark. 8:36). Let us reflect, how much faith do I have in the mystery of the Eucharist to nourish my whole life to attain eternal life. God Bless.
