#### Dear Friends in Jesus Christ.

Meeting with one of my friends during my last vacation, he sadly shared with me about his son. His son is top in his class, does everything wonderfully, and reads a lot, but recently the son blasted a bomb in their faith and in their expectation of him saving that the whole universe is created by science and there is no God. Believe me or not, this is one of the tragedies of this postmodern world. Many people think that God has nothing to do with this world and question the unquestionable reality called God.

Today as we are reflecting on the gospel passage we see; a scholar is raising a question to Jesus regarding eternal life- "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" By asking this question the scholar affirms that, there is a life after death. The answer to this question is very difficult, but Jesus puts it in a very simple way that he is to, "Love God and love Neighbor with his whole heart, with whole being, with all strength and with all mind." So, to enjoy eternal life, we should have love of God and love of neighbor. Everyone has love, everyone has loved, everyone loves, and everyone will be loved, but do we have a perfect love, a love that surpasses all limitations to live and to die for God and for our neighbor? John 15:13 says, "there is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." Today, Jesus is asking for this sacrificial love. Place vour hand on vour chest and check sincerely, do I have a perfect love?

Again, we have a second question raised by the same scholar to Jesus- who is my neighbor? The Christian meaning of "neighbor" is different from the social idea of 'neighbor,' and that is what we see in today's gospel. Yes, the question to be answered today is who is my neighbor? As Christians we should believe and accept the fact that it is not he or she is my neighbor, it is not wife or husband is my neighbor, but it is Christ who is my neighbor. That is why St. Paul says, "it is no longer I who live in, but Christ who lives in me". Yes, only as long as we are able to see the presence of Jesus in others, can we accept the other as our neighbor and love him/her sincerely.

The man who traveled from Jerusalem to Jericho and became the victim of robbers is Christ Himself. The robbers, the priests, and the Levites are each one of us. In different situations of our life we assume the role of robbers who try to have something, though we are not worthy, we assume the role of Priests and Levites, by becoming more religious and faithful, but today Jesus is looking for a Good Samaritan among us- who is approachable, who can care & nurse, who can understand, who can uplift, who can accommodate, who can foresee, and

and above all whose heart is full of compassion for the wounded. Are you one of those Samaritans? Or can you

When we see the plight and cry of the poor and needy, if we don't get transformed to the image of the Good Samaritan in the gospel, be sure we are not compassionate and we are not a good neighbor either. In the last Judgment scene from St. Mathew 25: 40 & 45 we read, "... I assure you, as often as you did it for one of my least brothers, you did it for me. ... I assure you, as often as you neglected to do it to one of these least ones, you neglected to do it to me".

So, my dear friends, Jesus is inviting us to fill our hearts with perfect love, because only if we have perfect love can we have compassion, and only if we have a compassionate heart, can we become a good neighbor. Till today if you have not grown into a good neighbor, be sure you can become a good neighbor and you have the possibility to change, God gifted us with this day to change our lives and thus to change the world.
