Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

The Gospel of John 1:11 says, "He came to his own and his own people rejected him." Sad to say, even today these words are very relevant, because in todays' world it is His own so-called people who turn against Him and take offense at Him more than anybody else. The people of Isarael were waiting for a Messiah for many years, however, when the Messiah came, they were not prepared to welcome Him. When we read through the Gospels, we can see that it was the Jewish people (His own people) who mostly rejected Jesus more than anybody else. Reflect about the Gospels of the last couple of weekends; the chosen disciples rejected Him, by not having faith in Him when they were confronted with a life-threatening situation in the sea. Today, every bit of our thoughts, words and actions without true faith in God is the same as rejecting Jesus in our lives.

Through the sacrament of Baptism every Christian is invited to a threefold role he/she must perform in his/ her life; prophetic, priestly and kingly. Today, the three scriptural readings remind us about our prophetic role to be played. In the first reading, we see the call and mission of Ezekiel to the rebellious Israelites. Ezekiel also was reminded by God that as God's prophet, he will have to face rejection and persecution for giving God's message. In the second reading we have another messenger of Christ, in the person of St. Paul who talks to us from his own personal experience. Paul says that, not only the prophets, but the apostles and missionaries as well, will have to encounter hardships and rejection in their preaching mission. Paul also invites us to rise above our own weaknesses and disabilities, cooperate with the grace of God, and preach the word of God by word and example as the apostle did.

When we come to the Gospel reading it is very clear that all that is said in the first and second readings are happening in the life of Jesus. The Gospel states that many people of Jesus' hometown did not accept Him as a prophet because they "knew" Jesus and His family too well. They knew Jesus as a carpenter with no schooling in Mosaic Law and knew that He is also a "son of a carpenter" that He can never be the promised Messiah who would come from Bethlehem as a descendant of David's royal family. Besides, they took offense at Him and guestioned his individuality and insulted Him, because Jesus did not do any miracles in their midst and admonished them for their lack of Faith. I am sure, during our life journey, some of us must have gone through the same type of situation like that of Jesus in the Gospel, and how did we react to that situation in our lives? I am sure we have taken offence at those people who questioned and insulted us. But look at Jesus, it was not Jesus who was taking offense at

them, but rather it was the people who are taking offense at Jesus. It is here that the true nature of a prophet is uncovered.

Dear friends, as Christians, whenever we failed to play the role of a true prophet in our Christian life, surely, we have taken offense at Jesus like His hometown people. Jesus comes to us in different ways wearing the costume of poor, rich, sickness, problems, difficulties, tensions, worries, word of God, sacraments etc. How do we respond to all these situations? Right at this moment Jesus is coming to us through the Word of God and through the Holy Eucharist, and how authentic are we in listening and accepting the Word of God and offering this Mass? Remember, whenever we are careless in listening to the word of God and at the Mass, we are just representing the people of Jesus' hometown.

Jesus makes a serious comment about His hometown people's attitude: "A prophet is not welcomed in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." This comment is directed towards you and I, because we are the chosen people who are supposed to carry the Risen Jesus through our lives and so His native place, His own kin and dwelling place is each of us. If we fail in this task, who else will do this in this world? Today, if we find that the world is losing its quality, be sure we Christians are losing the quality of life that Jesus has given us. So, let us be faithful to the Lord always by living the Faith Jesus has given us through His Passion, Death and Resurrection. **Amen.**
