Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Every country, state and community, has their own different customs and traditions to be followed, and they are the heart and identity of that country, state, and the community. Traditions and customs should be encouraged, because it increases the sense of belonging in people to their own country, state and community. At the same time, customs and traditions can be dangerous at times, when they take an upper hand in the lives of the people and make their lives miserable. Mark 2:27 says, "Then Jesus said to them, the Sabbath was made for man, and not man for Sabbath." Jesus always valued and gave priority to the life of a person, rather than customs and traditions of His time. Jesus always strongly fought against all kinds of customs and traditions that were against the dignity of human persons. By strongly speaking against certain customs, traditions and laws, Jesus was not violating them, but He was making aware of the true meaning of them to the world. This is the reason Jesus says to us through the Gospel of Mathew 5: 17, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them."

Today we are in the twenty second Sunday of ordinary time and the readings are inviting us to reflect on the best way to obey God and a religion for the sake of our salvation. In our first reading, Moses reminded his people about God's commandment and asked them to be faithful to them, so that they may be successful in life. He also warned them not to add or remove anything from it. However, this warning was not paid much attention to by the Pharisees that they multiplied the Ten Commandments to about six hundred and thirteen (613) legal codes. Through this, they made the life of the people very miserable and convinced them that that is the right way of following God and a true religion. On the other hand, the pharisees, did not bother to follow them in their lives. In the second reading the apostle James defines that true religion is that of keeping the Word of God and doing God's will by helping the poor and the weak in the community. He challenges Christians to become doers of the Word of God, not merely hearers.

In the Gospel we see that, Jesus describes true religion as serving God and all His children with a pure and holy heart. Jesus confronted the Pharisees for of their hypocrisy. They never observed the law that they multiplied for their people. Furthermore, Jesus says that: *"What comes out of a man is what defiles him,"* By saying this Jesus is calling us for a s self-evaluation. As Catholics we should be careful about our life and our attitude toward others outside the church. We must not live a hypocritical life, or even make life difficult for others. The malicious intentions, the hatred, pride, and corrupt tendencies

we harbor in our hearts are what define and make us who we are. Jesus reminds us that they are the greatest hidden enemies of our spiritual life. Yes, the quality of our life is measured by the quality of our heart and mind. If our mind and heart are infected and sick, our body would be sick a thousand times more, even without our knowledge. So, the most important thing that God needs from us is a pure heart as Christ taught us: "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God" (Mt 5, 8). Remember, those who see God, cannot ignore their neighbor. So, the best way to be faithful to God's command is to allow our hearts to be transformed by it. This is what St. Paul says to us, "Let your hearts be inwardly transformed so that you will know the will of God." (Rom 12, 2). Yes, as Christians, God's will must be the law of our daily lives, and it will motivate us to love others and to avoid evil in our lives. Finally, the psalmist reminds us that, "the just shall live in the presence of God." So, let us humbly pray like David: "Create a pure heart in me O Lord and, put a new and loyal spirit in me" God Bless.
