Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

There is the story of a young woman who talked to her pastor about the sin of pride. She said, "Every Sunday I come to church and look around and think to myself-I am the prettiest girl in the church. I try hard to stop this thinking, but I just can't. Am I horribly sinful?" The pastor looked at her and said, "No dear, not horribly sinful; just horribly mistaken."

The three readings of this Sunday speak of God's mercy and compassion to His children despite their repeated sins. Readings also remind us that through occasional punishment in the form of natural or manmade tragedies, God also tries to discipline His children. Thus, God expects us to show our repentance and renewal of life in Him by producing the fruits of love, mercy, forgiveness, etc.

The first reading tells us how God showed His mercy to His chosen people of Israel by giving them Moses as their leader and liberator. The God of Abraham. Isaac, and Jacob revealed Himself to Moses from the burning bush and assured him of His presence with the people of Israel during their journey to the promised land. God declared His intention to use Moses as the leader who would rescue His people and lead them to the promised land a "land flowing with milk and honey." The second reading warns us that our merciful God is also a disciplining God. Paul reminds the Christians of Corinth that they must learn from the sad experience of the unfaithful Israelites in the desert who were punished for their sins by a merciful and just God. The merciful and gracious God is also just and demanding; and so, we must turn away from our sinful ways of life.

Today's Gospel explains how God disciplines His people and invites them to repent of their sins, and to produce the fruits of the Holy Spirit. As we reflect about the Gospel of today, we can see three kinds of tragedies are mentioned. Firstly, human tragedy caused by evil people; secondly natural tragedy caused by accidents or natural calamities and thirdly the greatest tragedy of eternal separation from God in hell. Many of us have experienced the effects of the first two tragedies. Citing two tragic local incidents in today's Gospel, Jesus reminds the Jews and us to repent of our sins by saying, "... unless you repent you will all likewise perish," so that they may not face the greatest human tragedy-eternal damnation. By citing two tragic events, Jesus also warns his listeners not to spend their precious time worrying about the guilt of others, but to concentrate on examining their own lives, and their own need for repentance and forgiveness.

Since many centuries, may people ask the questionwhy do innocent people suffer? Though most of the situations, most of us may not have a convincing answer, Jesus' life is the clearest evidence that innocent people suffer and always sin is not the reason for the suffering. At the same time sin can lead to tragedy but not every tragedy is the result of sin. On the one hand, Jesus says that those who do not repent will perish but on the other hand, Jesus also tells us a parable about the patience of God. The fig tree in His parable is a familiar Old Testament symbol for Israel. As the fig tree is given one last season to produce fruit before it is cut down, so Jesus is giving Israel one final opportunity to bear good fruits as evidence of its repentance. Through this parable, believers are reminded of the patience of a God Who is willing to give sinners chance after chance to reform their lives and to seek reconciliation. Even when sinners waste or refuse those chances, God, in His mercy, allows still more opportunities for them to repent. Just as the farmer tended the barren fig tree with special care. God offers graces to sinners to leave their sinful ways behind and return to God's love and mercy. Divine grace is expressed as justice with compassion, and judgment with mercy. But we cannot continue to draw strength and sustenance from God without producing fruit. God does not tolerate this type of "spiritual unproductiveness." So, Jesus reminds us again, "... unless you repent you will all likewise perish," During this Holy Mass, let us ask the grace of the Lord to give us a contrite heart. God Bless.
