

This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

We reflected about the unconditional love and forgiveness of a loving father to his unfaithful sons in last weekend's Gospel. Last weekend, the main accusation of the oldest son against his younger brother was that he wasted much of his wealth with prostitutes. Today, we see the attitude of Jesus towards a prostitute, a public sinner. As always, as His nature Jesus extends His love and forgiveness to the prostitute woman too with a condition; "do not sin anymore." As it is the nature of Jesus to extend His unconditional love and forgiveness to every repentant sinner, all three readings of today talk about the same message of love and forgiveness of God.

The first reading talks about how a merciful God forgives the sins of His chosen people and leads them back from the Babylonian exile. The same way we too are forgiven, and we are saved from our own sinfulness. In the second reading, Paul presents himself as a forgiven sinner who has been completely transformed by his Faith in Christ Jesus. Paul loves Christ so much that he wants to share in His sufferings and death so that he may share Christ's Resurrection. The story of sinful woman in today's Gospel, shows the unconditional mercy and compassion Jesus offers to repentant sinners. In addition, by asking the sinless person to throw the first stone at the sinful woman, Jesus forces the accusers to assess their own souls. Thus, He grants justice to the accusers and mercy to the sinful woman.

The Gospel says, "They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge against him." The scribes and Pharisees were pointing their fingers at the adulterous woman as 'the accused,' but their real intention was to build a case against Jesus. The sinful woman was being used as a tool to trap Jesus. Look at the attitude of scribes and phariseesmaking somebody else as a scapegoat for their selfish interest! When the Pharisees brought an adulterous woman to Christ, they thought that Jesus would condemn her immediately. They thought he would give them permission to go ahead and stone the woman to death: thus, to find fault with Jesus. However, they were wrong because Jesus Christ came to save and not to condemn. They were wrong because the ways and thoughts of Christ are different from theirs. So, instead of condemning her, Jesus restored her life and offered her a new chance to live. He simply told her: "Go and sin no more." Like this woman, Jesus is always giving us new opportunities despite our weaknesses. He knows how weak we are to sin. He knows the forces we confront in our life and society. His mission is to save us from all our sins and accusations. It is not to condemn us. Hence, Christ says, "I have come that they may have life and

have it in full" (Jn 10, 10).

Today, we should be encouraged by these words of Jesus "Neither do I condemn you." The complete forgiveness of Christ is incredible. When Jesus says these words to us, he means them. He means that He has taken care of our negative past. So, Christ will always fill us with Joy, which he will complete for us soon through His death and Resurrection.

Finally, as we approach the glorious season of Easter, the Lord equally says to us: "Go and sin no more." This is an injunction we must believe and put into practice. He promises us a better future and a share in His glory if we remain faithful to this command. Therefore, we must constantly run to Jesus irrespective of our situation. This is because He is ever ready to free us of all the charges against us. So, let us shout for joy as we sang in the responsorial psalm: "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." Yes, our God is ready to forgive our sins and so let us rejoice in HIM.
