A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

This past Sunday we celebrated the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, and the Gospel reading reminded us about the responsibility of a Christian, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved: whoever does not believe will be condemned." On His day of Ascension, Jesus not only reminded us about our primary responsibility but also promised us His special assistance through the power of the Holy Spirit. Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, and the promise given on the day of His Ascension is being fulfilled by sending the Holy Spirit upon His disciples. Today is the birthday of our Holy Mother Church and the Holy Mother Church officially takes up the legacy and the Mission of Jesus through the acceptance of the Holy Spirit by the disciples. Today, as members of the Church everyone is encouraged to celebrate Her birthday by being open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit by participating in the mission of the church, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." Thus today, we conclude our Easter Season and begin the ordinary season of missionary work of preaching through our lives.

From the first reading today, we see the reward of obedience and steadfastness in prayer. As Christ's disciples, every true believer is empowered by the Holy Spirit. He empowers us to go into the world to bring peace, unity, joy, love, and salvation to nations. In the second reading, Paul makes a very important statement: "No one can say Jesus is Lord, except through the Holy Spirit." This means that it is God himself that enables us to recognize and accept the Lordship of Christ through the Holy Spirit. Due to pride, it is difficult for Satan to acknowledge and accept the Lordship of Christ.

In today's Gospel, we see that the disciples of Jesus are hiding behind closed doors because of the fear of Jews. They were afraid, lost, and had many uncertainties; their body was safe and peaceful, but their hearts were not safe and peaceful. It is in this situation Jesus appears to them and breaks away all their false safety thinking with His presence and Peace. Dear friends, through this incident Jesus teaches us that, material things can offer us only temporary security for our bodies and, no security at all for our hearts. The security for the heart is nothing but the peace of Christ. The peace offered by Jesus in today's Gospel is not as the world gives; rather it is a peace that nothing in this world can take away.

The Gospel states that the disciples of Jesus are hiding behind closed doors because of the fear of Jews. During Jesus' public ministry, Jesus told His disciples everything about His mission, but the disciples were not humble enough to pay any

attention to His teaching. Their worry and concern were only about getting recognition and acceptance from the people by walking with Jesus. This is the reason why when people turned against Jesus, the disciples got scared and hid themselves. Dear friends, knowingly or unknowingly how many times and occasions we have hidden ourselves from preaching the Gospel values to others in our lives? Every time we give priority to social events, friendship, and relationships more than the spiritual events, friendship, and relationship with Jesus, remember we are hiding ourselves like the disciples in today's Gospel. Today, if you and I are not ready to stand up for Jesus, be sure Jesus is not going to stand up for us at the last judgment. Yes, our life here in this world is a time to make wise decisions about life after. Surely, a wise decision can be made only with the help of the Holy Spirit. So, let us ask for the help of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Let us ask ourselves: What does the Holy Spirit want me to do? Where is He leading me to? It is important to reflect on these questions, especially now that our world has become so complex, and many of us seem confused. We must pay attention to Him. We must let him lead and show us the best way. Yes, the spirit is given to us, we must begin to act with Him and act with His direction, if not we may have to regret one day in our lives. The Gospel of Luke 12:10-12 says. "Everyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but the one who blasphemes against the holy Spirit will not be forgiven. When they take you before synagogues and before rulers and authorities, do not worry about how or what your defense will be or about what you are to say. For the Holy Spirit will teach you at that moment what you should say." God Bless.
