A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

St. Theresa of Calcutta says, "we are not called to be successful, but to be faithful." As we reflect about the Gospel of today, we can see a conflict between faithful and successful. Jesus is trying to teach His disciples about how to be faithful and to be a true disciple, but the disciples are worried about how to be successful. Jesus was teaching His disciples about how to become greatest in the Kingdom of God, but the disciples are concerned about how to become greatest in this world. According to me, the conflict of interest between God and us is one of the major reasons for our spiritual dryness or spiritual laziness. In the Gospel we see that when Jesus is talking about His imminent passion, death and resurrection, the disciples have an indifferent attitude. The same kind of attitude we witnessed in St. Peter in last weekend's Gospel too. From the Gospels we know that the main interest of Jesus is nothing other than to build the Kingdom of God. Jesus has given us the promise that through and by the Kingdom of God, all our interests will be fulfilled, "first seek the kingdom of God and His righteousness and everything else will be added unto you." Just as Jesus has given us the promise, how many of us can give a sincere promise to the Lord by saying, let me have my dreams fulfilled and I will work towards the building of the Kingdom of God?

Today's readings invite us to become great in the sight of God by doing God's will as Jesus did, surrendering our lives to Him in the service of others. In the first reading, the book of wisdom urges us to choose the path of righteousness despite painful consequences. In the second reading, James warns the Church, and us, that selfish ambitions destroy peace and cause conflicts and war. So, James advises us to choose the path of righteousness and humble service which leads to lasting peace. When we come to the Gospel reading Jesus gives us a glimpse of what walking that path of righteousness, by welcoming and serving the vulnerable in our midst, especially defenseless children, the despairing poor, the mentally ill, and the marginalized. Jesus also teaches His apostles that child-like humility and selfless service make one great in the eyes of God.

Being baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, what is our priority in our lives? To be greatest in the Kingdom of God or in this world? Jesus wants all of us to be greatest in the Kingdom of God by sharing in His Passion, Death & Resurrection. Every time, we celebrate the Holy Eucharist, each of us are called to share the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, but how many of us are sincerely prepared to share His Passion, Death and Resurrection in their lives? Most of the time we see that many of us get distracted with many things and distract others, don't

pay much attention to the Holy Mass and do not value and care for the spiritual presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist like the disciples in today's Gospel. Remember, there is no bypass to become the greatest in the Kingdom of God without sharing the Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. That is what Jesus reminded us in last weekend's Gospel; "if anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself take up his cross and follow me."

Dear friends, if we seriously reflect it, we can realize that the main problem with most of us not being able to experience God is our own egos and pride. Just like many of us, the disciples also had the same problem, and so they were not able to pay attention to the teachings of Jesus and know His will, but they were fighting. The same way, knowingly or unknowingly our ego and pride abort the fetus of Jesus in each of us; and thus, actively or passively we encourage the presence of evil in this world. Yes, it is the priority that matters. If so, the assignment for each of us for this week is to decide about our priorities and live accordingly. If our priority is in accordance with the will of God, we shall enjoy the blessings, otherwise be prepared to face the consequence. **God Bless.**
