### Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Today we celebrate both Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday. While Palm Sunday signifies royalty and triumph, Passion Sunday signifies both suffering and love. By freely going to Jerusalem, Jesus shows His humility and willingness to save us. This is the time of year we stop to remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. What we commemorate and relive during this week is not just Jesus' dying and rising, but our own dying and rising in Jesus, which will result in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption. Active and attentive participation in the Holy Week liturgy will deepen our relationship with God, increase our Faith, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus. Today's celebration reminds us of the dual nature of our Christian lives and journey. We celebrate today and are persecuted tomorrow. Today we are loved, while the next day, we are hated. Today we are praised and accused the next day.

Today's liturgy combines contrasting moments, one of glory, the other of suffering: the royal welcome of Jesus in Jerusalem, and the drama of the trial, culminating in crucifixion, death and burial of Jesus Christ. An important lesson we must learn from all this is that, as life unfolds, it presents us with its different dimensions. The same people who sing praise in good times might be the same people to criticize us in the future. Yes, life is a mystery, no one can predict human life.

As we reflect about the reading of today, we can see the great humility of Jeus in all the situations. The first reading speaks about Jesus' own life and mission and presents Jesus as the suffering servant of God. Jesus humbly endured His suffering without any resistance. The Responsorial Psalm prayer," My God, My God, why have You abandoned Me?" plunges us into the heart of Christ's Passion. The Second Reading, taken from Paul's letter to the Philippians demonstrates the Christian understanding of who Jesus is: "Though he was in the form of man, He did not regard equality with God."

In our first Gospel reading we see the Last Supper of Jesus with His disciples. At the Last Supper, Jesus humbled Himself by serving His disciples and eating at the same table with the one who was to betray Him. "...And yet behold the hand of the one who is to betray me is with me on the table." Despite all these, He taught His disciples to humble themselves just as He humbled Himself before Pilate and the chief priests even until death.

The passion reading describes the royal reception Jesus received from His followers, who walked with Him for two miles: from the Mount of Olives to the city of Jerusalem. In the second part of the Gospel, we are challenged to examine our own lives in the light of some of the characters in the Passion story; such as like Peter who denied Jesus, Judas who betraved Jesus, Herod who insulted Jesus. Pilate who acted against his conscience as he condemned Jesus to death on the cross, and the leaders of the people who protected their position by getting rid of Jesus. In all of these, the lesson for us today is that humility is essential in all life circumstances. This includes both good and bad times. Christ was strong, but He humbly became weak for our salvation. He taught us that true power lies in service. He also taught us that humility is one of the most important virtues we need for our service and mission. During His solemn entry, Christ rode on a colt which symbolizes humility. In His suffering, Jesus abandoned Himself to His enemies without resistance or striking back. Let us, therefore, pray this Sunday that the Almighty God may grant us the humility with which to follow and serve Christ all the days of our life. Amen.

One of the great traditions of our faith is the use of sacred oils as an outward sign of the grace bestowed through the sacraments. Each year, these oils are freshly prepared during Holy Week.
