Sacrament of Baptism
The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance
Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):
Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage
A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

When the disciples were faced with a life-threatening situation in the sea in last weekend's Gospel, Jesus confronted them with a question- "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" The Gospel of today is an answer to the question, as well as a lesson for the disciples to learn to believe than just following Him. When the twelve disciples failed to demonstrate their faith in Jesus today, we see two strangers profess their faith in Jesus publicly. Thus, today we are all invited to reflect about the depth of our faith in Jesus Christ and asking us to be a true witness of our own faith, not by just following, but by living especially during our difficult moments.

We all experience imperfection, brokenness, temptation and sin; however, this is not the plan of God for us. God had/has a wonderful plan for all of us but the disobedience of our first parents messed up everything. Our first reading says that, "For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him. But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world." However, God can fix everything to good, provided we use the remedy given to us by our heavenly Father-**Jesus Christ**. Yes, Jesus is the solution to all our problems today. In the second reading, St. Paul says that God has generously given us everything and continues to say that, "for your sake he became poor although he was rich, so that by his poverty you might become rich."

Yes, Jesus wants to lift us up from our imperfection, brokenness, temptations and sin. Jesus wants us to have the fullness of His life in all of us now, and this is what we see in the Gospel today. The Gospel of today presents two miracles of Jesus. These miracles are pieces of evidence of the wish and plan of God for us. They teach us that while Christ desires to liberate us from all forms of captivities, we must have faith to receive our miracles. The synagogue official Jairus' daughter died, and Jesus raised her to life again. The woman afflicted with hemorrhage for 12 years was cured when she touched Jesus' cloak.

Through these both healing miracles, Jesus reminds us that, we will be able to enjoy His life in us only through the power of faith. Jesus said to the woman afflicted with hemorrhages for 12 years, "your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." He says to the synagogue official Jairus, "Do not be afraid, just have faith." In the case of the woman with hemorrhages, we see that Jesus embarrasses her in public, asking who touched him, making her afraid? The reason is that; He wants the public to know that she is healed. She was considered unclean in Jewish thinking. When someone was unclean it meant he or she could not worship with the community. The woman could not

go to the temple for twelve years. Anything she touched would also be considered unclean. If she was young and married, she could not have children because if she touched anyone, even her husband, he also would be unclean. So, when the woman was healed by touching Jesus' cloak, not only was she physically healed, but also socially, psychologically and spiritually. Now everyone knows she can worship with them again, she can socialize with them again, and if she is young and married, she can have children. Jesus has completely changed her life.

In the house of Jairus Jesus said the child was not dead but asleep. Jesus said to her, "Little girl, I tell you, arise." Jesus says to each of us, "Don't go through life asleep, arise." We see something in common in both miracles; someone went to Jesus in faith, the little girl's father and the woman. The same way, when there are problems, go to Jesus with faith. Don't stay where you are, get up and go to Jesus. How can we go to Jesus? We can go to Jesus through prayer, reading the Bible, sacraments etc., So Jesus says to us, "come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." So, as believers in Jesus Christ, let us not make Jesus as our last option in our needs but let Him be the first option and thus enjoy the life of Christ within us in its fullness. **God Bless.**
