Sacrament of Baptism
The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance
Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):
Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage
A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

A nervous lector was reading during the Holy Mass. At the end of her reading because of her nervousness, instead of concluding the reading with the statement, *"This is the Word of the Lord,"* she made an emphatic concluding statement, *"This is the end of the world."* And the whole congregation faithfully responded, *"Thanks be to God!"*

The Scripture Readings of today speak about "the end of the world," "the end of time," "the final coming of Jesus" and our ultimate future. The readings give us a warning of events that are yet to come.

In the First Reading Daniel challenges us to continue to trust in God, despite the everyday doubts we experience. He then speaks about Michael, the Archangel of God, who will lead the just and those who work for justice into the everlasting life of heaven. In the Second Reading we reflect on the meaning of our future with God. The author recalls the saving work of Jesus Christ through His passion, death and resurrection through which God gave His grace of new life in Jesus Christ to become a true disciple of Him. When we come to the Gospel reading, we hear about the end time, the day of gloom & doom and about the Second and Final Coming of Jesus. The Second Coming of Jesus is never to be seen as a 'threat' to our well-being, but as the 'fulfillment' of our hopes and dreams for a world of peace and harmony. So, when Christ will come again in glory to judge us, we're to look forward to that with joyful anticipation. To those who believe in Christ, such an event is seen not with fear but with joyful anticipation ... It is not that He will come to us but that we will enter a deeper relationship with Him when we pass through death to a different kind of life. After explaining all bad things going to happen prior to the establishment of the Kingdom of God, Jesus says very emphatically, *"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away."* Dear friends, it is a warning to each of us to place our trust in the word of God and change our lives accordingly to meet the Lord, when He returns to us in glory. Right now, the only preparation that God is expecting from each of us is REPENTANCE.

During our spiritual journey we hear a lot about repentance, however the truth is that the word 'Repentance' has not gone deep into the hearts of people, but only skin deep. The reason is that our love for God is conditional. The book of Genesis 6:5-6 says *"The LORD saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the time. The LORD regretted that he had made human beings on the earth, and his heart was deeply troubled."* To bring about a change in the attitude of each of us, God takes some corrective

measures in different ways, but the problem is that often some people don't discern them as corrections, but as punishments and so they take an offense at God.

In the book of Exodus, we see that to liberate the people of Israel from Egypt, there were many plagues sent to king Pharaoh and to his kingdom and instead of humbling himself to free the people of Israel he became harder and harder. Today, many people assume the attitude of king Pharaoh. Yes, every problem around us seems to be unimportant until the same kind of problem affects us personally. In the Gospel of Luke 13:2-3 Jesus reminds us that *"Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way? I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish."* Examine the number of times the people of Israel were put in tests for their infidelity during their journey to the promised land!

St. John the Baptist came calling for repentance. Jesus came calling us for repentance. Today, Jesus comes to us through word of God calling us for the same. Are you ready to take the call seriously? The very purpose of the call to repentance is to safeguard our soul. Remember, it is not the body that is important, but the soul. *"Those who have ears, let them hear."* **God Bless.**
