Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

We live in a world where people are looking for temporary happiness rather than permanent happiness consequently not many are satisfied in their life. This is exactly what St. Augustine says in his famous book called 'Confessions' "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." The same restlessness we can find in the first reading from the attitude of the Israelites and in the Gospel from the attitude of the people who were looking for Jesus, and so Jesus challenges each of His followers, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled".

During the three years of Jesus' public ministry Jesus went around and preached Good News, casted out devils from many, cured many sick people, performed many miracles, and thus bringing new life to many people. The main intention behind performing all supernatural powers was to deepen the faith of the people in God and help them to lead a good life according to the will of the Father. However, most of them followed Jesus just looking for miracles and healings, clearly saying they looked for their own personal benefits rather than increasing their faith in God. In different occasions we see, even the disciples had the same type of attitude. Do we have the same type of attitude in following Jesus? As we reflect the Gospel of today, the questions to be asked are- what am I looking for from Jesus? Why am I looking for Jesus in my life?

If we do not have the right motivation in following Jesus, other than deepening our faith in God/Jesus, we are on the wrong track and so Jesus reminds us "Do not work for the food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you". What is the food that the Son of Man offers for us to ensure eternal life? It is the food of the Eucharist. How can we get this food in its full taste? Jesus says- "Believe in the one He sent." Dear friends, without faith the Eucharist we receive becomes a waste and becomes a problem, a problem of wasting time, a problem with many reasons to skip Masses. If we receive the Eucharist with true faith, it becomes food for our soul and assures us eternal life.

As Christians we should keep in mind that, the Eucharist is the most expensive gift and most beautiful wisdom of God made possible for each of us. To do all kinds of signs such as: miracles, healings, casting out demons etc., Jesus did not have to bear any kind of pain on Himself, but to quench our hunger and thirst, to become a Holy Eucharist, and to be present in a piece of bread Jesus bore extreme pain on Himself by sacrificing

Himself fully for us. So, let us not approach this beautiful sacrament carelessly, but with great care and reverence. As we are present in the Holy Eucharistic celebration let us not look for the material blessings from the Lord that perishes, rather look and ask for the gift of faith which will give us an eternal life. It is to have this wonderful gift of faith and to experience this wonderful giver of faith through the Holy Eucharist, Jesus invites us all "I am the bread of life, whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Blessings!
