A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

Laurie Beth Jones was/is the consultant of many multi-national companies, who is also the author of bestselling books like Jesus in blue jeans, Jesus CEO etc. She writes in her famous book Jesus CEO, "as a society, we like the sound of hammering; but we are uncomfortable with the sound of thinking, which is silence." Yes, the author says nobody wants to enjoy the sound of silence in their lives. What is this sound of silence? This is the desert experience that we see in today's Gospel; a time to listen to the voice of the author of the world.

Today, we are living in a world of sound pollution, which is alarmingly increasing day by day. As we are in the Christmas season, this pollution has increased even more. As most of us are already thinking and talking about the variety of food and looking for different types of gifts to make Christmas more colorful, how many of us have talked about making a good confession for this Christmas and thus making a way for the Lord into our own hearts? Don't you think that we all need a break from this same kind of Christmas celebration every year, just buying and sharing some gifts and enjoying some food? Please remember that the magic of Christmas is not in the present, but in His presence.

In today's world, most of the problems faced by human beings can be solved, if we are ready to enjoy the sound of silence in our own lives. Look at Joseph. when his heart was greatly troubled knowing about Mary's conception, he forced himself to the sound of silence, the Bible says, "While Joseph was thinking about this, an angel from the Lord came to him in a dream." Look at Mother Mary, when her heart was troubled when the Word of God came to her to conceive Jesus in her womb, the Bible says, "Mary pondered what sort of greeting this might be."
